Great Start Readiness Program (GSRP) (4 year olds)

- ◆ State-funded, criteria-based program
- ◆ Offered 4 half days weekly
- ◆ Low child to teacher ratio
- ◆ Integrated kindergarten readiness curriculum (ZooPhonics, literacy-based learning, pre-math activities)
- ◆ Parent participation and family activities included
- ◆ Home visit support
- ◆ Works in cooperation with Head Start

Early Childhood Developmental Delay (ECDD)

Program:

ECDD is a special education preschool program designed to foster and develop basic learning skills for children from three through six years of age with physical, cognitive, language, hearing, visual emotional or autism spectrum disorder impairments. The program focuses on developmentally appropriate school readiness skills, and has been created to meet the individual needs of each child. The ECDD team prepares the children for and provides them with, the skills needed to make a successful transition to the elementary school. Children who qualify for the program receive specialized instruction from certified staff. These services may include:

- ◆ Speech and Language Therapy
- ◆ Occupational Therapy
- ◆ Physical Therapy
- ◆ School Social Work Services
- ◆ Individualized Education Plans

- ◆ Pre-Kindergarten program for young 5's born June 1 – December 1
- ◆ Eligibility based on screening process
- ◆ All day alternate day schedule
- ◆ Development of fine motor and gross motor skills
- ◆ ZooPhonics– multi-sensory letter/sound recognition program
- ◆ Math concepts through hands-on exploration
- ◆ Social emotional development
- ◆ Understanding concepts of print through literary experiences
- ◆ Understanding the role of student in a community
