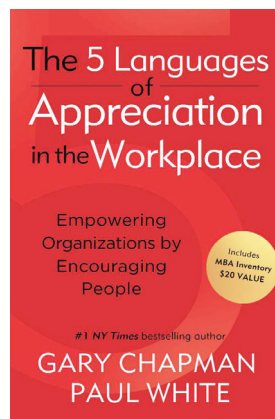


School Board Sponsors its 2nd Annual "One Community—One Book" Event

In an effort to build community dialogue about public education, the Allendale Board of Education is sponsoring its 2nd Annual "One Community—One Book" event with the book, *The 5 Languages of Appreciation in the Workplace* by Gary Chapman and Paul White. Over the winter months from January through March, community members and staff are encouraged to check-out the book at any of our school buildings or at Allendale Township Library. In March, several discussion groups will be held about the book.

The *5 Languages of Appreciation in the Workplace* helps supervisors, staff members, and volunteers effectively communicate appreciation and encouragement to staff members and peers, resulting in higher levels

of job satisfaction, healthier relationships, and decreased cases of burnout. Ideal for both the profit and non-profit sectors, the principles presented in this book have a proven history of success in businesses, schools, medical offices, churches, and industry.

New Legislation Changes Board Elections

In November, Governor Snyder signed into law new legislation which moves all Board of Education elections to the November general election of even-numbered years. Previously, Board of Education elections were held in May of each year. With the change to elections in even-numbered years, the Allendale Board of Education amended its bylaws at its December 12th Regular Meeting to comply with the new legislation. This means that voters will see two Board of Education seats on their November, 2012 ballot for six-year terms.

With this change, the Board Trustee Elections will be for two seats in 2012, three seats in 2014, and two seats in 2016. This 2-3-2 arrangement will insure continuity on the Board of Education and move Board terms of office to six years.

2012 Regional Scholastic Art Awards



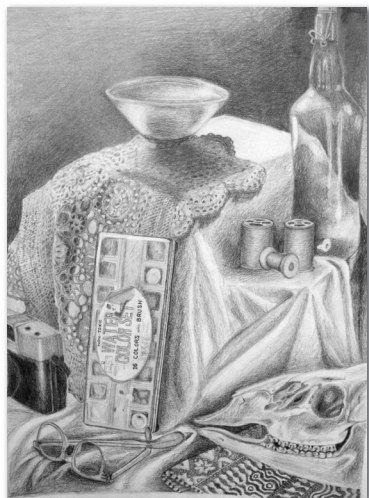

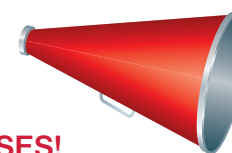

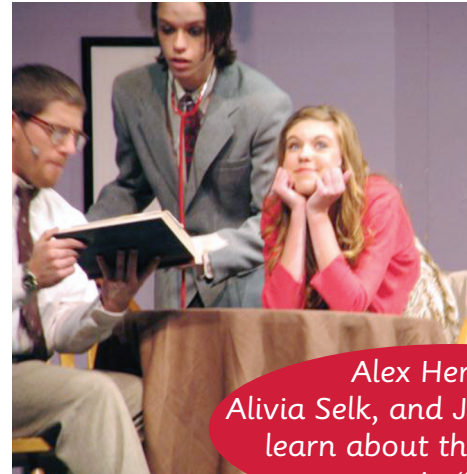


ALLENDALE STUDENTS TAKE THE STAGE IN A COMEDIC AND ENTERTAINING YEAR

The 7th Annual Science Olympiad Fun Day is a Big Success!

On Saturday November 5th, 2nd graders through 5th graders had a chance to experience what Science Olympiad is like. The Allendale High School Science Olympiad team ran a day of Science Competitions for their younger school mates. Both the High School Team and the younger students had a day of fun and science.

The 2nd and 3rd graders were up first in the morning with the following events:

Chopper Challenge: Teams of two had to build 3 helicopters out of one piece of paper. Winners were determined by adding up the total air time for all helicopters.

Egg Drop: Teams of two had to build a device out of straws and tape

that would help an egg survive a fall from the bleachers. Winners were determined by survival of the egg and how close they were to a target.

Pasta Bridge: Teams of two build a bridge out of pasta that has to hold weight. Winners were determined by which bridge held the most weight.

Leaf It: Teams of two had to identify common Michigan trees by their leaves. Winners were determined by who identified the most leaves correctly.

Pentathlon: Teams of two rotate through 5 questions and 5 physical activities. Winners were determined by the fastest time.

Draw It /Do It: One person from a team of two draws a picture of an object. The first partner leaves and the second partner comes in to find a bag of parts and their partner's drawing. Winners are determined by who builds an object closest to the original object.

The 4th and 5th graders did similar events but had more age appropriate challenges. Paper Towers replaced Pasta Bridge and Write It / Do It replaced Draw It / Do It.

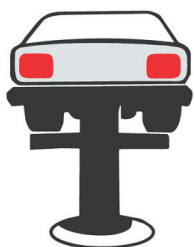
Medal winners and participants alike are happy after a good competition



Paper Towers: Teams of two try to build the tallest tower out of one sheet of paper and 30 cm of tape. The tallest tower that stands for at least 5 seconds wins.

Write It /Do It: Same rules as Draw It / Do It except students must write a description of the object instead of drawing it.

The top three teams for each event received medals and everyone else got a participation ribbon. Though some were disappointed for not getting medals, a good time was had by all. Hope to see even more students next year, the first Saturday in November.

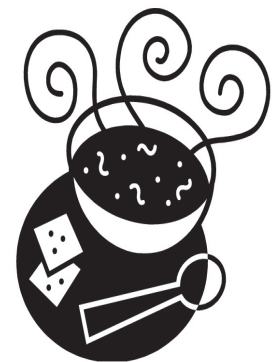
