WHY DO WE HAVE A SCHOOL BALLOT ISSUE IN FEBRUARY?

THE FEBRUARY 27, 2024 BALLOT PROPOSAL WILL ALLOW THE SCHOOL DISTRICT TO CONTINUE TO LEVY 18 MILLS OF NON-HOMESTEAD MILLAGE ON ALL COMMERCIAL BUSINESS, RENTAL PROPERTIES, VACANT LAND AND SECOND-HOME PROPERTIES. IN ORDER FOR THE SCHOOL DISTRICT TO RECEIVE ITS FULL OPERATING REVENUE ALLOWANCE FROM THE STATE, THE DISTRICT MUST LEVY 18 MILLS.

What is the 18 mill Non-Homestead Millage?

The 1993-94 Proposal A changed school funding and redefined how taxes on property are assessed. As a result, public schools must levy 18 mills on non-homestead properties to receive full State Foundation Grant funding. Tax revenues from this millage are utilized in the District's general operating budget. It is important to note that this is NOT a tax on homestead properties, and is NOT a new tax - it is a proposal to continue the existing 18 mill assessment on NON-HOMESTEAD PROPERTIES only.

What does "Non-Homestead" mean?

You do not pay this tax on your primary home. It is only paid on property that is not a primary residence such as businesses, investment property, a vacation home and rental property.

What is the financial impact of the renewal?

The State of Michigan provides APS the Foundation Grant Allowance less the 18 mill levy on non-homestead property. Any amount levied less than the 18 mills is not reimbursed by the State. If the millage is not renewed, the District would lose approximately \$4,950,000 per year beginning January 2025. The State will not replace this funding, and the District would be faced with finding alternative funding, or implementing steep cuts in programming and staffing.

What does this mean to Allendale residents?

On February 27, 2024, Allendale voters will be asked once again to vote on the state mandated 18 mills on nonhomestead properties. The District is requesting a four year renewal of the non-homestead 18 mills and an additional 3 mills that may be used only to restore the 18 mills, should Headlee rollbacks occur. Without the non-homestead millage renewal, all of the District's operating millage would be reduced to zero when the current millage expires in December of 2024. If the proposed renewal is approved on February 27, 2024, homeowners will NOT see an increase in their property taxes on their primary residence. This is not a new tax, but rather a proposal of the District to continue to levy the 18 mills for the non-homestead tax as it has since 1994. Approval of the millage will give the District the continued ability to collect full State funding for its schools.



TO REGISTER for Kindergarten or Young 5's children must be 5 years of age on or before September 1, 2024 to attend for the 2024/2025 school year.

Parents of children turning 5 between September 1st and December 1st, 2023 may submit online registration, Allendale Public Schools will make every effort to consider your child's registration.



★ REGISTRATION DOCUMENTS NEEDED:★

- 1. Birth certificate (county issued) (original or copy)
- 2. Proof of residency (utility bill, lease/mortgage work best)
- Complete up to date official immunization record or valid waiver (DPT, Polio, MMR, Varicella, Hep B)
- 4. Health appraisal form completed and signed by a physician dated 2023 or newer
- 5. Proof of vision, hearing and dental screening

<u>The above items are not required at the time of registration, but must be provided</u> <u>BEFORE your child can attend school.</u>

There is no need to submit a new registration for your child. If your child is currently attending Young 5's or Kindergarten at Allendale Public Schools they are expected to continue for the next school year.



On January 22, the Outdoor Discovery Center came to Evergreen Elementary to help our first graders learn about Michigan vertebrates (animals with backbones). Ottawa County Water Conservation Work


