






On February 20, AHS hosted the Save A Life Tour. Our students took part in a virtual reality impaired driving simulator that illustrated the dangers of impaired driving from a sober perspective by showing how alcohol and drugs can affect a driver's reaction time, motor skills and judgment. They were also able to utilize a distracted driving simulator, complete with a smartphone that the students used to send and receive text messages, this showed how distraction affects reaction time with a split-second delay that caused participants to demonstrate tendencies similar to that of a distracted driver. There were two large monitors displaying real life statistics and testimonials on the dangers of both impaired and distracted driving.

That's why APS is offering MathCamp and LitCamp **at the same time** for a full 7 weeks throughout the summer! For students that can benefit from lessons designed to narrow a learning gap in Math or Literacy, their camp experience will be tailored specifically to their needs. Students that would benefit from a challenge of extending their on target progress during the school year will have a schedule tailored to their needs, too.
