

## USA Officials Association Mike Robillard Memorial Scholarship Application

The USA Officials Association will be offering two scholarships of at least \$250.00 to a graduating male and female from area high schools. Winners will be chosen by the USA Officials Association (USAOA) Executive Board, or its representative.

#### **Eligibility criteria:**

- Each applicant must be a graduating senior, have a 2.5 GPA and be involved in some manner with the athletic program of their school. This could include, but is not limited to, playing a sport, working in the athletic office, serving as a team manager, or being a student trainer, etc. Applicants do not need to be "star athletes" but be individuals who best display sportsmanship, citizenship, dedication and determination.
- Although school administrators and athletic directors will be informed of the program and encouraged to share the information with nominees, the students themselves will be responsible for submitting an application for consideration. The application will give nominees an opportunity to share the reasons that they feel make themselves deserving of one of the scholarships.
- Two letters of recommendation shall accompany the completed application.
- To be considered for the scholarship, the nominee may not be related to anyone who is an active USAOA Executive Board Member.

#### **Instructions:**

- 1. Carefully complete detailed responses as listed on the application. It is important that all elements of the application are completed and submitted together. Please provide a typed document.
- 2. Answer all questions. If a statement does not apply to you, simply write N/A.
- 3. Two letters of recommendation shall be provided by teachers, school administrators, supervisors, or employers to complete this application. Recommendations from family or friends will not be considered.
