How do you know students will choose the correct classes?
High school counselors will meet with all $8^{\text {th }}$ grade students on March 12 and 13. Students will be given a registration packet and will be told what their class options will be for $9^{\text {th }}$ grade. High school counselors will then meet again with $8^{\text {th }}$ graders in their social studies class on March 17 where the students will enter there $9^{\text {th }}$ grade class requests through their student portal in Infinite Campus. At the end of this session a print out of the requests will be brought home for a final parent signature and then returned to Mrs. Gioia who will get the signature page to the high school counselors.

What if my child has Algebra 1A for Trimester 1 and doesn't have Algebra 1B until Trimester 3? Is this a problem?
No, this has not been an issue. It is actually less of a time gap than when a student has Algebra 1 in the first two terms and then doesn't have their next math class until the next year. Our teachers teach for mastery of the subject so that gaps are not an issue.

What if my child has a different teacher for the second part of a class (ie. Murphy for Algebra 1A and Gembis for Algebra 1B)?
Occasionally factors like class availability, the number of sections in a given class, and class size do not allow teacher consistency. Our teachers that teach the same class, work together to stay on the same pace and use common assessments for the students.

Will my child get everything on his/her schedule that he/she requested? What if he/she doesn't?
Students will get the required classes for each grade. Some students will not get all of their elective choices due to class availability or course conflicts. Contact the guidance office to check class availability.

## How will students know which lunch they are assigned?

Lunch is determined by the third period class. Your child's third period teacher will be assigned either Lunch A or Lunch B. This will be your child's lunch time as well. This will show on their schedule.

## What if I want to request a teacher for my child?

Your can always make a request; however, it is not always possible to honor a request because of class size, class availability, and schedule conflicts with other classes.

When will my child receive his/her schedule for next year?
Your child will receive his/her $9^{\text {th }}$ grade schedule in August. The pick up day will be sent to you over the summer through the mail. The school will be open on this day and there will be an opportunity at this time to find classrooms, lockers, etc.
